

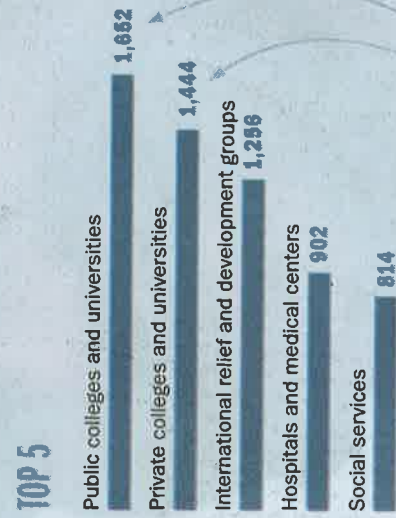

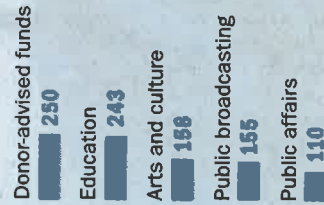
# WHO'S UP? WHO'S DOWN?

We broke charities down by category, then determined which type of group over the past 25 years had claimed the most spots on the Philanthropy 400—and the fewest.

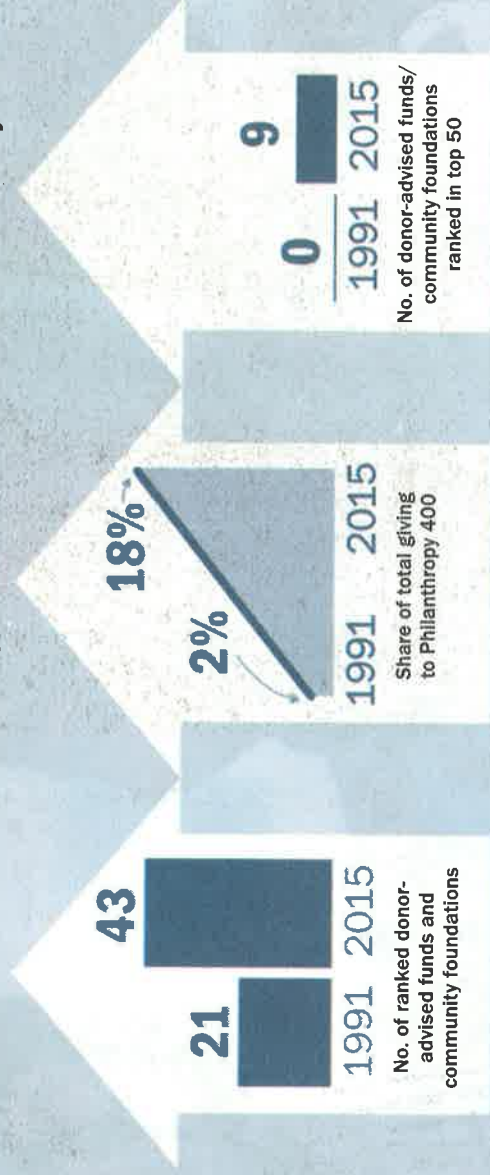

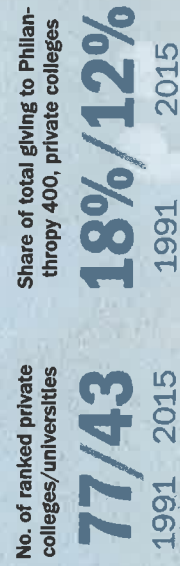
### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Donor-advised funds and community foundations have become a force in charity.



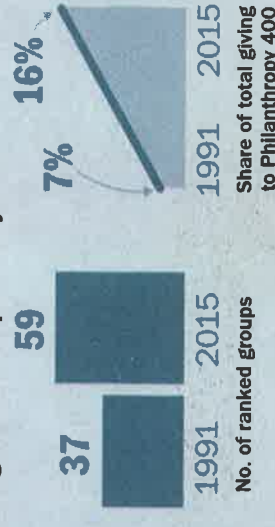
### HARVARD'S GREAT, BUT ...

### VIVA THE INTERNATIONALS!

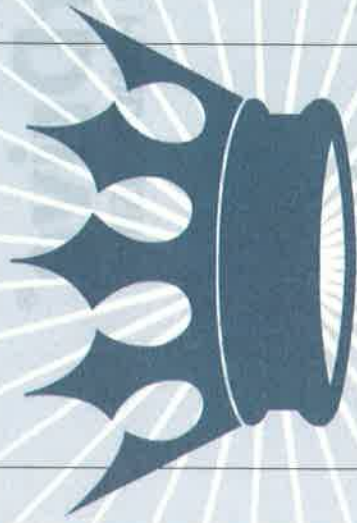
Global relief and development groups surged over the past 25 years.
